### **1. Assess where you are and what you want to accomplish.**

And when Joseph left Pharaoh's presence, he inspected the entire land of Egypt.

**Genesis 41:46b NLT**

### **2. Dreams die without the faithful execution of a system.**

As predicted, for seven years the land produced bumper crops. During those years, Joseph gathered all the crops grown in Egypt and stored the grain from the surrounding fields in the cities. He piled up huge amounts of grain like sand on the seashore. Finally, he stopped keeping records because there was too much to measure. **Genesis**

### **4 Steps to an effective system to reach your goals:**

#### **#1. Recruit the right people to your team. (the who)**

"Therefore, Pharaoh should find an intelligent and wise man and put him in charge of the entire land of Egypt. Then Pharaoh should appoint supervisors over the land and..."

**Genesis 41:33-34a NLT**

#### **#2. Set a goal with clear measurables. (the what)**

...let them collect one-fifth of all the crops during the seven good years. **Genesis 41:34b NLT**

#### **#3. Determine the steps to take to accomplish the goal. (the how)**

Have them gather all the food produced in the good years that are just ahead and bring it to Pharaoh's storehouses. Store it away, and guard it so there will be food in the cities.  
**Genesis 41:35 NLT**

**#4. Always tie your goals and plans to saving lives. (the why)**

That way there will be enough to eat when the seven years of famine come to the land of Egypt. **Genesis 41:36 NLT**
